Background

Based on an assessment of county courthouses conducted in 2003 that identified over \$95 million in capital needs, the program is designed to assist with the rehabilitation of historic county courthouses statewide. Since 2005, over \$18 million from the State Capital Budget has been allocated to the Courthouse Rehabilitation Grant Program. Grants are awarded as matching funds to counties, with grant awards working to leverage more than \$48M million in overall capital improvements to date. Since its inception, the program has been run through the Department of Archaeology & Historic Preservation (DAHP).

Benefits

Based on survey information, 33 of Washington's 39 counties possess courthouses eligible for designation in a variety of historic registers. The grant program works to assist counties as they endeavor to preserve these diverse and valuable landmarks while at the same time serving as a tool for local economic development.

Accomplishments

Since 2005, the program has achieved the following:

- 59 grant awards have been made to 26 counties statewide, with 58% of funds going to 14 eastern WA counties and 42% of funds going to 12 counties in western WA.
- \$18 million in grant funds have worked to leverage more than \$48 million in overall capital improvements, leading to a return approaching \$3 for every \$1 in contributed funding.
- Preservation of key features that define and characterize these community landmarks.

Local Economic Stimulus

- Rehabilitation projects utilizing grant funds have created hundreds of construction jobs;
- Historic rehabilitation work is more labor intensive than new construction;
- Rehabilitation supports local contractors, subcontractors, and specialty craftspeople;
- Sales tax revenues remain in-state at the local level.

2019-2021 Biennium

The Courthouse Steering Committee has recommended \$1.69M to fund 10 courthouse projects statewide. The Governor's proposed Capital Budget includes \$1.321M to fund the top 8 projects in the 2019-21 biennium. The Washington Trust for Historic Preservation strongly supports full funding as recommended by the committee for all 10 projects.


